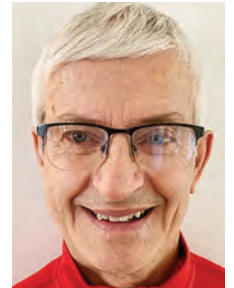

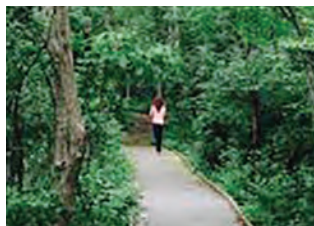
### Memorial Weekend Picnic

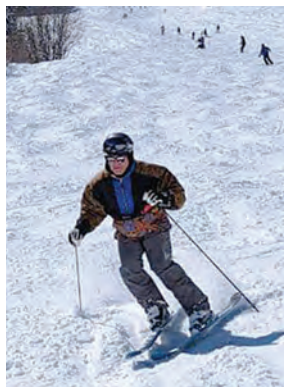

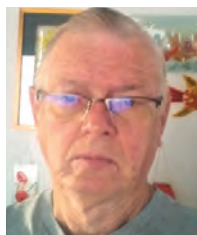
#### Lester Radtke
