We know of the MACC Fund ("Midwest Athletes Against Childhood Cancer") from so many local organizations, activities, and sport stars connected to it, such as the Brewers, Bucks, Packers, Aaron Rodgers, Candy Cane Lane, Walks, Runs, etc. But how does it all happen? Who puts it together and decides how all the money that's been raised since its founding in 1976 by Jon McGlocklin and Eddie Doucette gets allocated? Come hear John Cary, Executive Director since 1982, tell us some of the fantastic stories of helping kids with cancer or blood disorders. During

John's tenure, after he left Harnischfeger Corp. as Special Events Director, the MACC's annual income has grown from \$250,000 to \$4.7 million in 2015. The MACC has contributed more than \$55 million to Wisconsin-based research for the treatment of kids throughout the state, nation, and world while helping to raise the overall cure rate for childhood cancer from 20% to 80% in the past 40 years. 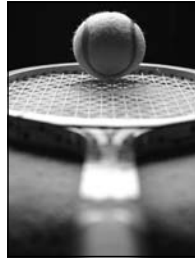
FREE Tennis Refresher
