### Vagabond Race Team

Captain: Al Lemke The 2015 -16 MMSC ski race season was another Vagabond



success story with our Vagabond men and women winning the overall combined team championship for the four-team, season long competition, totaling 52 racers. Our team consisted of 21 racers. Our women's team finished first and won 5 of the 12 races with very close competition. The men's team finished first winning 10 of the 12 races. Together the Vagabond men and women won the combined championship, finishing a combined first in 11 of the 12 races! In order of finish behind the Vagabonds were the Snowmad, Sitzmark, and Holy Hill ski teams.

Six of our racers finished first in their class for the season. Awards were won by most of our race team members throughout the season and will also be presented to those who finished in the top 3 of their class for the season at our banquet on April 23rd. A racer must have at least 6 starts with a minimum of 2 slalom races and 2 giant slalom races to qualify for year-end points. **Congratulations to all of our dedicated team members!** 

Team season competition, like individual season competition, counts the 6 best finishes of 12 possible races. For each race, the top 4 men's times count for the men's team, the top 2 women's times count for the women's team, and the top 4 men's and top 2 women's times combined count for the combined team standings. A team effort was needed throughout the season to have enough good men and women finishers for their respective team.

Our race team is one of our Club's draws for members as young as 21. <u>Please promote the Vagabond Race</u> <u>Team to attract young members to our</u> <u>Club.</u> Skiers under 21 can race for another club with a special MMSC Senior Racing Independent membership, or as a "temporary" at each race. We've had fun practicing, racing, drinking, dining, and doing whatever else always comes after the skiing.

The following racers started the required combination of six slalom and giant slalom races (2-4, 3-3, 4-2) and placed in these divisions for the season. Points to determine a season standing for racers bumped to a new class during the season are as if they raced in the new bumped to class all year.

# Attention Skiers!

V e have an opportunity to help ourselves and the ski membership of the Club. As many of you know, one of our trips next season is to Vail, CO, at the end of January 2017. Vail and other properties owned by Vail Associates offer the Epic Pass, which allows discounted rates on lift tickets. If you purchased a day pass this past season at Vail, without any discount, the day rate was \$150. As a ski club, we often qualify for a discounted group rate if we have 20 or 20+ members sign up for lift tickets. Members who buy or renew their Epic Pass on their own do not count for the this group rate. For example, if we have 25 members on a trip and 6 have an Epic Pass, we will not get the discounted group rate.
