

#### **July Bike Rides**

Monday, July 4, 9:15 am "Mel Malcolm Memorial Ride" Interurban Trail Meet at Libby



Montana's Restaurant located a couple of blocks west of Green Bay Rd. (Hwy 57/Cedarburg Rd.) at 5616 W. Donges Bay Rd., Mequon. It is next to

the bike trail and has a large parking area on its east side. Meet at 9:15 am and be ready to leave at 9:30 to ride the Interurban Trail to Cedarburg in time to watch the 4th of July parade. This part of the ride is 14 miles round trip.
