Law Enforcement, Training, Self-Defense

This Roundtable will be very powerful, meaningful, enlightening, and important to any of you who might be interested in self-defense. Hear some incredible stories about the training that members of our law enforcement go through in order to serve and help protect us. Our speaker is Jeff Smidt, the son of our own Vagabond Don Smidt. Jeff proudly served 32 years with the Waukesha County Sheriff's Dept., going through the ranks of enforcement officer, then 5 years on the Gang Crimes Unit, 8 years on the Homicide Team, 22 years on the SWAT team, 26 years on the Underwater Search & Recovery Unit, and 25 years on the Sheriff's Dept. Firearms Training Unit. He was also trained by the FBI, the US Dept. of

Justice, NYPD, LAPD, Chicago PD, US Navy & Army Special Ops, and graduated from Northwestern University's Police Staff & Command School. Jeff is the sheriff who ran up to the van and made the arrest on James Oswald after James and his father, Ted, crashed into a tree during that dramatic Waukesha chase scene 22 years ago. Now retired, Jeff helps people learn to defend themselves and runs the Wisconsin Firearms Training Center next to Sluggo's and Boulder Junction on Burleigh where he teaches firearm safety and use if needed to defend oneself. his is my favorite time of the year! People get renewed with the sweet smell of autumn, and though maybe I'm pushing things a tad – I am truly looking forward to: September 1 when all the ski trips open – hooray!

And in preparation, here is a little tip. Keep a record of your boots, skis and poles. Be sure to include the make and model of the equipment, the serial numbers, and include any identifying marks in your records. In case of theft, these details need to be reported to the police to help you recover your skis.

Also buy a ski lock. The locks are easy to carry in your pocket, have a nice long retractable wire line. Now the line may be cut if someone has wire cutters, but the lock is a great deterrent for someone who might 'accidentally' take your skis.
