WAS THAT BALL IN OR OUT? Always treat your opponents [and partner] with courtesy and respect."


Here are some guidelines:

- 1) Your opponents call the shots on their side of the net. You call them on your side of the net.
- 2) If the ball touches any part of the line, it is in!
- 3) If you can't clearly tell whether your opponent's shot is in or out, it's in!
- 4) If you didn't see the shot, it's in!
- 5) In doubles, the person closest to the ball should make the call. You should not call balls wide if you are on the far side of the court and your partner is closer to the ball.

- 6. Observe all posted signs and warnings. Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
- 7. Prior to using any lift, you must have the knowledge and ability to load, ride and unload safely.
