reflected immediately so that other members will see the new information right away, rather than having to wait until the next Directory is published. No one HAS to use these features—it's up to each member how they choose to interact with the Club, how they pay their membership dues, how they choose to register for events, etc. We are also working diligently to assure that Event Leaders have what they need so that events continue to run smoothly, and that every member, whether they use these new streamlined features or they choose to register for events through U.S. Mail, or at meetings, will have an equal chance to register, and that no one will be excluded from popular events because of their chosen registration process.
