Warming Up

Before beginning to play tennis, we warm up by hitting balls back and forth to each other. "It gives you an opportunity to loosen up, to hit a few ground strokes, a few volleys, maybe a couple of overheads, hopefully several serves. And while you are going through your warm-up shots, your opponent is also going through theirs. So you owe it to him or her to provide some nice feeds that can be hit back to you."

"In other words, the warm-up is not the time to hit incredible angle volleys," or other shots that your warm-up partner will probably not be able to return or won't give them an opportunity to warm-up properly.

"Going through the warm-up appropriately is a required act of tennis etiquette." It is designed be a cooperative exercise, where you both try to hit returnable shots to each other. Remember, "no points are awarded for incredible shots made during the warm-up before the match starts."


Sun., Feb. 26 1:30 pm, Nashotah Park.
