OTHER OPPORTUNITES TO ENJOY --Waukesha County

Lapham Peak State Park: (W329 N846 County Hwy C, Delafield) offers 17 miles of groomed trails for cross-country skiing. There are lighted trails for nighttime skiing until 9 p.m. For snow conditions, call (262) 646-4421.

Hiking and snowshoeing are available to explore several miles of trails that are not groomed. Ski trails are off limits to hiking and snowshoeing when they are snow-covered.

Ski and snowshoe rentals are available at Lapham Peak; see their website for details on trails maps and prices. State Park fee is required – daily or annual membership.

Retzer Nature Center: (S14 W28167 Madison St., Waukesha 53188) offers hiking and snowshoeing. The grounds are open

daily until 10 p.m. No daily permit is required. No dogs. Snowshoe rentals are available as conditions allow.

New Berlin Trail: (from Greenfield Park west to Waukesha.) Hike or snowshoe on flat path that was once a railroad line. No snowshoes for rent.

EIM Grove Park: (loop in Elm Grove.) This is one of our favorite parks to walk in our Walk season, and has mostly flat, paved walkways, great when snow-covered for snowshoeing. No snowshoes for rent.
