Etiquette for Dining Out: Though I am not Ann Landers, my name (Sally Borchardt) does go on all of the reservations along with "Vagabond Ski & Social Club." With that being said, I would like to address the tipping (or lack thereof) of some of our members for the service they get from the



wait staff at our Fish Fries — service that I think has been quite wonderful. The state of Wisconsin recognizes an 18% tip as being standard, and I am told that the state uses that figure when it estimates what percent the wait person likely owes the state for taxes. I personally think it is

much simpler just to tip 20% when figuring what tip to add to the bill. If your service is better than minimum, you can certainly add more, too. In talking to a waitress, I was told that typically waitress wages are only about \$2 an hour, so tips become extremely important to support them. They work hard and have smiles on their faces when serving us at fish fries. So please be generous to them when leaving tips, so the owners will welcome us back for future fish fries. It might even make you feel better to know that you gave a nice tip. Thanks, Sally.



TENNIS TIP OF THE

Here's a tip a pro recently gave me that has been very helpful to me. When playing, particularly in a challenging match, a player's hand can start to grip the racket tighter and tighter, making his or her hand and arm tired or cramped. To counteract the fatigue and cramping, try holding the racket in your other hand as much as possible, such as between points, when retrieving a ball, or while changing sides of the court. It will help to rest and relax your hand and arm, and help your swing be more fluid.






